Paragon was proud to present Team Lead Sheikh Islam and Security Guard Mohammed Faraz an award for the greatest achievement in a Security Professional's career, saving a life.

T/L Sheikh was on a routine building patrol when he noticed someone in distress. The individual had a length of fabric wrapped around his neck and had tied it off against a railing, in an apparent attempt to commit suicide.

Acting quickly, T/L Sheikh called his partner S/G Faraz requesting assistance in retrieving an AED and First Aid Kit, and to contact 911 for emergency assistance. At the advice of 911 operators, T/L Sheikh cut the fabric tied around the individual's neck.

The individual was unresponsive and without a pulse. T/L Sheikh and S/G Faraz began emergency first aid and lifesaving efforts until Toronto Police Service arrived on site and took over the scene. After 45 minutes, TPS/Paramedics were able to revive the individual. It is without a doubt that T/L Sheikh and S/G Faraz's actions aided in the preservation of life.

Both gentlemen have been nominated for a Canadian Security Lifesaver Award, for their heroic efforts.
